#### **PREFACE**

In 1982, The Countryside Recreation Research Advisory Group decided to publish an annual compilation of the current and prospective research programmes of agencies represented on the Group (see list of member agencies below), so that more information about this work could reach a wider audience of interested organisations. The first edition of the compilation appeared in June 1982. This publication is the second in this series and contains information on Countryside recreation research and recent publications, correct as at the end of March, 1983.

In content and inevitable limitations, the document closely resembles the 1982/83 edition, with the exception that a thematic index has been included. Each project has been allocated a code which relates it to the relevant agency programme and appears both in the main text and at the appropriate point in the index.

Although considerable effort has been made to edit agencies' research programmes as originally submitted, into a common format, the result does not disguise the varied nature of the individual programmes nor the differing extents to which the programmes have a bearing on countryside recreation as strictly defined. A range of choice has been exercised by each contributor in the cut-off between that judged to be relevant to CRRAG and that not, with some lists more tightly drawn than others. The compilation is only complete for the national agencies represented on CRRAG (there is no contribution from the Water Space Amenity Commission, since it is scheduled to disappear in September 1983). It is planned to include some of the research undertaken by local authorities in each edition, subject to the logistical problems facing the Local Authority Associations represented on CRRAG, in collecting periodic data from member authorities. Research collated by the Association of District Councils and the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities for 1982/83 is included in this edition, but is not indexed. It is hoped that programmes from the Metropolitan Authorities and the County Councils will be published in the 1984/85 edition.

A listing of this kind is of short term value as it stands, in that programmes of research are often subject to change according to the availability of resources and changing operational needs of sponsoring bodies. Therefore, not all the prospective items listed may, in fact, proceed. However, to mitigate these circumstances, at the end of each section is the name, address and telephone number of a suitable contact in the respective agency, who will be pleased to respond to enquiries and requests for further information.

It is hoped that this compilation will be of value and interest to those with an involvement in countryside recreation and allied fields. Further copies are available free of charge from the Research Unit at The Sports Council.

# REGIONAL TOURIST BOARDS RESEARCH PROGRAMMES 1983/84

The schedule on the following pages records brief particulars about the 1983/84 research programmes of Regional Tourist Boards. It is based on information provided in March and April 1983 to the Research Services Branch of the English Tourist Board by the twelve English Regional Tourist Boards. A total of 53 projects is recorded, 19 were in progress at the time information was supplied. 15 were definitely agreed; 11 likely but not yet certain; and 8 still tentative.

Of the 53 projects, 37 were to be undertaken "in-house" by Regional Tourist Board Staff. 6 were to be commissioned from an outside body or individual, and 10 were research projects undertaken by other agencies, to which Regional Tourist Board staff were to contribute in some capacity.

The topics covered by the research programmes are diverse, as the following categorisation indicates.
